Camper Rules & Expectations

- Campers are to not have phones or electronics out other than during lunch.
- If campers are found using an electronic device during camp hours, they will be asked to put it with their belongings.
- Campers will be expected to bring their own lunch, swimsuit, towel, water bottle, and gym shoes to camp each day. Parents must provide their child a floaty if the child needs it.
- All campers will be expected to participate in the activities and games played throughout the week with an exception to swimming. If there is an issue with a camper participating, please contact the Lead Counselor or the Summer Camp Administrator. Campers are not expected to swim if they or parent/guardian is uncomfortable.
- All campers are expected to be friendly and respectful to others. If this becomes an issue, campers
 may be asked to sit out of an activity or parents/guardians may be called.
- All campers are asked to be responsible for their own belongings and as well as responsible for themselves. This means campers should be doing what they are supposed to do.
- SSHRC does not tolerate bullying or harassment. Campers that are bullying others will have parents notified and asked to leave the camp that day. If additional reports of bullying occur, campers will not be allowed back following camp weeks.
- Campers who are misbehaving will receive corrective action from a camp counselor, then a verbal
 warning will be given, and if issues are still unresolved, they will have a direct meeting with the Summer
 Camp Administrator and parent and/or guardian will be notified.
- Campers are to always stay with the group. If there is a need to use the restroom or leave the group
 they must be with a counselor if they are below the age of 10. If they are above the age of 10, they will
 be assigned a buddy and asked to stay together then return to the group. No camper is to be alone
 during camp!
